## Meet Dr. Gene Aitken, APAC 2009 Guest Conductor

The guest conductor for this year's festival is Dr. Gene Aitken. Dr. Aitken is no stranger to HKIS as he has conducted the Southeast Asia Honor Band and held Jazz and Concert Band clinics at the school. As a wind ensemble conductor, clinician and adjudicator, Dr. Aitken is in demand worldwide.

In June 2007, he received the United States' top jazz education honor by being awarded the 2007 Jazz Educator of the Year by *DownBeat* magazine as the seventh inductee into its Jazz Educator Hall of Fame.

On 25 July 2007, Dr. Aitken appeared on ABC World News direct from Erbil, Iraq, conducting the American Voices Jazz Bridges Combo and Big Band as part of a 10-day festival in the performing arts. One of main goals of the Festival was uniting the Shiites, Sunnis, Kurds, and many other cultures and religions.

On 12 May 2007, Dr. Aitken conducted China's top military band, the Military Band of the Peoples' Liberation Army of China, in Beijing, for the opening of their new Concert Hall.

In addition to his contributions to the field of jazz education and music technology, Dr. Aitken was active in the Los Angeles area for many years, writing and conducting movie scores for full orchestra as well as serving as co-director of the Los Angeles Jazz Workshop.

## Meet Jonathon Clarke, Guest Trumpeter

Mr. Clarke studied at London's Trinity College of Music where he earned a Bachelor of Music degree studying both the modern and the natural trumpet with Robert Farley. He went on to receive a postgraduate diploma (performance) from the Royal Academy of Music, where he worked with the leading trumpet teachers in the United Kingdom.

After graduating in 2001, Jonathan freelanced in London with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and the BBC Concert Orchestra. He also worked extensively in 2001-2002 in the Netherlands, where, as guest principal trumpet, he had the opportunity to work with many great conductors and composers.

Mr. Clarke is currently the Principal Trumpet of the Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra.
