Jazz musos delighted as Aitken hits town

The region's up and coming jazz musicians will this week get a chance to learn from one of the best jazz educators in the business.

Downbeat Magazine's Jazz Educator Of The Year Award winner Dr Gene Aitken will drop by Wollongong today and tomorrow to run a series of workshops.

Earlier this year the American was in Iraq leading jazz ensembles that united Shiites, Sunnis, Kurds and many other religions as part of a 10-day jazz festival in performing arts.

In May this year Aitken conducted China's top military band and conducted master classes on how to build their instrumental programs.

The respected jazz educator was head of the University of Northern Colorado jazz department, considered one of the top programs in the US, for nearly 25 years.

Dunan said he was excited that Aitken had included a stop in Wollongong during his first visit to Australia.

He said in the past few years Wollongong Conservatorium of Music had developed an international reputation for jazz education.

Aitken will work with jazz ensembles and jazz vocalists at the conservatorium as well as a workshop with the Bulli High School Jazz Band during his two-day residency in Wollongong.
