Bulli jazz on top of the world

ONE of the world's top jazz educators is visiting Wollongong this week to pass on some musical know-how to budding jazz musicians at Bulli High School.

The world renowned Dr Gene Aitken will be in Wollongong at the invitation of the Wollongong Conservatorium of Music.

Dr Aitken has more than 40 years of experience in the world of jazz and earlier this year visited Iraq, where he led jazz ensembles to help

unite different religions.

In May this year he conducted China's top military band and gave them master classes.

This is his first visit to Australia.

The Director of Jazz Studies at the Wollongong Conservatorium Eric Dunan has been working with the Bulli High School Jazz Band for the past five years.

He said Dr Aitken will be able to pass on some great wisdom to the group. "He'll be addressing jazz techniques and also improvisation techniques and also how to play together as an ensemble - similar stuff to what I do - but he brings 40 years of experience to the table and has worked with jazz ensembles all over the world, and has more experience than what I can possibly have," he said.

Mr Dunan said he is very excited about the potential of the Bulli High School Jazz Band.
